There is no doubting, the 21/22 financial year presented a mixed bag of emotions for everyone, the arts community were certainly not immune to these ups and downs. Whilst we were seasoned Covid negotiators and competitors, this did not lessen the stress for arts organisations, particularly those with events on the agenda. Having said this, BAF had some huge wins (let's face it, it has been a marathon) in this period, and I must thank the Board and Associates for their determination to deliver our "essentials" and so much more.

Many of you will be aware that we had postponed our 20th birthday celebrations in 2020 (for obvious reasons), in favour of a 21st, apparently a much more auspicious milestone for an arts organisation, so our illustrious and generous Patron David Hobson informed me. So, after realizing we would need to sit out the beginning of 2021 in terms of larger events at least, we took a breath, planned our calendar for post lockdown and made a fabulous start to this financial year with the delivery of a winning Masterclass early in July (details below). We optimistically selected dates in the final guarter of 2021 for two key celebratory events that had been postponed in 2020, one of these being our big birthday bash Made in Ballarat concert. No amount of energy or determination could stand up to a lengthy lockdown topped off with a dollop of uncertainty, so we regrettably rescheduled these events for autumn 2022, and finally managed to get over the line to slide to victory just in time! Read on for the details of these terrific events.

Within this reporting period, we announced a new Patron in Fiona Sweet, the past Director of the Ballarat International Foto Biennale. We thank her for her energy and time. Details of the newly formed Patron's circle and their fundraising activities are outlined below.

Of course, our 2021 grant round was completed in October as always, so well supported by our Grants and Mentoring committee and culminating in another online presentation ceremony. We announced some new Named Awards during this period. The Haymes Family Foundation Award, The Jess Crowe Memorial Award for Tertiary Education and The Stubbs Roberts Award all add to a growing list of award opportunities for 2021/22, thank you to all our Named Award donors. We held an online Annual General Meeting in October but managed to have face to face Board meetings in November and December which heralded a slow return to normality in 2022 and a busy events schedule as we worked to deliver those previously postponed functions.

Sadly, during this period, we lost a talented member of our Alumni, artist and philanthropist Jess Crowe. Jess received her grant in 2006. Jess was extremely generous to BAF over the last couple of years of her life and was able to see her generosity translated into direct support for Arts Education, before she passed away. Members of her family have arranged to continue to support a named award in her honour, the award will support Tertiary Education in the Arts. The BAF family are forever grateful for her support and dedication to our sector, she will be sadly missed.

BAF finished this financial year with a strong financial result as you will see in our Profit and Loss on page 13. I would like to acknowledge the unwavering and growing support of our community in ensuring the growth and effectiveness of the Foundation through financial support and in-kind offerings, as we strive to continue to provide a relevant program of support services and events

BAF farewelled the dedicated Lou Coffey as the Executive Assistant after 3 years of service to the organisation. A huge thank you to Lou for her support and many voluntary hours during this time. We then welcomed the appointment of Megan Riedl as our new Executive Assistant in 2022. Megan is an Alumnus of BAF and brings many skills to the role.

Together, the Board, active Associates (see list on page 19) and our Executive Assistant, (just under 20 people in total), manage to find a balance of initiative, innovation and consideration to achieve our primary goal (grant making to emerging artists), whilst developing new programs as community needs evolve and become evident.

The Ballarat Arts Foundation Grant Round is always inspiring, exciting and filled with hope. As the application season closed mid July 2021, BAF saw 33 hopeful and aspirational artists draw on their creativity to develop projects and then have the courage to apply to the Foundation for over \$125,000 worth of funding to bring these projects to completion. We noted a small swing away from performance-based requests, a likely reflection of the unpredictable live events horizon at that time. We recognised the desolation of the arts industry in the last 2 years and commend and congratulate those who are persisting with art making. We are so pleased to be able to assist in some way through our granting programs.

Our interviews were once again held via Zoom on August 14th and surprisingly didn't seem all that strange - it's funny what you get used to! Ultimately, we selected nine successful grant recipients who would share in over \$16,000 worth of funding. We were proud to announce that including this current grant round, we have now awarded over \$260,000 worth of grants in our 21-year history.

This year we discovered resilience, brilliance, and clever adaptation in the swathe of fascinating and Covid-proof projects that came forward for consideration. There was an interesting focus on nature, sustainability and the development of content for children, possibly all a reflection of the year that was! Along with determination and grit within the arts community, we also recognise



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our determined Ballarat community, united in their quest to ensure that Ballarat artists continue to receive a leg-up, so to speak.

A big thank you to the Grants and Mentoring (G&M) Committee for taking on this Covidnormal approach to zoom meetings, on-line interviews and the resulting on-line awards presentation, in their stride. The members of the committee are: Wendy Rechenberg – Committee Chair, Tim Sullivan, Tamara Boyd, Stuart Maiden, Damien Woods and Carolyn Guirguis.

Within this period, the G&M Committee also identified a need for a different type of grant as artists tried to get back to work in the public arena. We therefore introduced the Small Equipment Grants in April, offering the opportunity for artists to apply for up to \$350 for a piece of equipment, not necessarily tied to a project. This was well received, and monthly applicants are reviewed and notified. The program is set to continue into the next financial year.

At BAF, we always start the financial year on a roll, as we are inevitably halfway through receiving Grant Applications. As mentioned above, 2021 - 2022 was no different. Just before our application season closed, we were so fortunate to be able to deliver an exceptional event.

On July 4th, 2021 (in a momentary lapse of Covid restrictions), we were able to deliver a performance based Masterclass with the generous involvement of David Hobson, Lisa McCune and Roland Rocchiccioli, with the assistance of Federation University. This really was a remarkable event, as many of our audience would tell you, the participants visibly improved before our eyes, and the feedback was amazing. There were 13 participants, each receiving a dedicated 20 minutes of coaching from this amazing trio.

This was followed by a unique fundraising dinner, at the Canberra (thank you so much Malcolm Roberts for your on-going in-kind support), where guests were not only treated to an up close and personal performance by David and Lisa, accompanied by our very own Wendy Rechenberg, but then dined beside these generous celebrities including Roland, well into the night, a truly unique opportunity. Long time BAF supporter Peter Ford and his amazing catering staff guaranteed that the food and overall dining experience was indeed memorable. This type of event reinforces the network and wider community of BAF that



continue to support the organisation and the individuals within it, as time passes. Of course, our network continues to grow and adds value in ways that are unquantifiable.

As the grant application season ended mid July, a high standard of applications ensured a delightful interview day in August, albeit on-line.

BAF held its on-line AGM on October 5th, the annual report for last year capturing the essence of the previous year with an image of our on-line gallery for the 2020 Eureka Award on the front page. Thank you again to Stuart Sullivan for his design expertise and for working to a tight timeline for the production of the annual report.

Grant selections were made and our second online grants presentation came to life via YouTube on October 12th, this is still available to watch on our station.

During this period, we made the sad decision to postpone our long awaited Victorian Opera event and the Made in Ballarat concert, to after Christmas.

The 2021 BAF Mentoring program would come to a close with the closing workshop, held at the Ballarat Golf Club in November. The event was truly inspirational, and we thank the City of Ballarat for their contribution. The success and subsequent continuation of the Mentoring Program should be attributed to our Associate Dr. Tamara Boyd, who donated her time and expertise to lead the program, and is continuing again this year. This is another example of an outstanding contribution by members of the BAF family. Aside from Tamara's outstanding leadership, many alumni and other supporters, offered their expertise as Mentors, or bravely asked for help as Mentees, leading to development outcomes for both sides of the relationship, as is often the case through Mentoring. We thank all the participants for enabling the Foundation to achieve its objectives in running a successful program.

As 2022 began, we were optimistic and the BAF Launch Event at The Canberra Hotel on the 16th March reflected our intent to achieve all we had postponed and more. A new Patron was announced in Fiona Sweet, former Director of the Ballarat International Foto Biennale, long term supporter of BAF and the judge of the Eureka Prize for 2020.

Finally the long awaited Victorian Opera concert on the 2nd April at Her Majesty's theatre was delivered. This event celebrated an outstanding contribution to Opera in Victoria, through the generous donation of the Ballarat Opera Prize, by BAF's own Malcolm Roberts and Michael Stubbs. The concert was entitled Heroes and Villains and featured the 2021 winner of the prize, Mr Stephen Marsh and other performers. The program included some of opera's most passionate arias, duets and ensembles alongside a 12-piece orchestra and was a fundraiser for BAF. There was a special VIP experience for a limited number including an afterparty at the iconic and recently renovated home of Dr Michael Whitehead, where guests rubbed shoulders with the performers and staff of Victorian Opera and other opera lovers, this experience which formed a fundraiser for BAF.

We were invited once again to a dinner with the Rotary Club of Ballarat South on April 7th, where were would update the club on our achievements, Megan Riedl would perform and the winner of the Denis Bateman Award Community Service for 2022 would be announced by special guest Brett Macdonald. The award went to long time BAF Board Member and community hero, Gordon Williamson.

We were fortunate yet again to utilize the gorgeous space at the Canberra Hotel for Board and ex Board Members and Associates to come together for a commemorative luncheon on the 23rd April. Attendees reflected on the history and future direction of BAF whilst enjoying an overdue catch up with old friends.

Buninyong Community Bank and Ballarat Grammar School were featured as sponsors of the long overdue Made in Ballarat Concert on May 15 at the Wendouree Centre for Performing Arts, alongside Dean and Pauline Stevens, Paula Nicholson, Susana Yung and the Little Cupcake Shop. This was a celebration style concert as part of the Made In Ballarat series that has been part of the BAF offering since early on in the history of the organisation. Like previous years, the concert featured many Ballarat born celebrities and emerging local artists. The line up included our Patron, the generous and talented David Hobson and almost 60 other participants, including a fabulous stage band assembled by Musical Director Damien Woods. Interval was flavored with 300 cupcakes from The Little Cupcake Shop Ballarat.

The program featured something for everyone, with song, music, dance, comedy and recitation with visual arts alumni also being represented on the big screen as images of artworks accompanied the live show.

A new Patron's Circle was initiated, and events immediately arranged. The initial fundraising luncheon was held at the home of the Chair on 18th May. This saw a group of 16 ladies come together to hear from the new Patron Fiona Sweet and each other, and celebrate and bolster support for the arts and BAF. The group were enthusiastic and encouraged to provide financial support for the Mentoring Program, raising sufficient funds to support attendees at the Closing Workshop to be held later in the year.

The Opening Workshop of the 2022 Mentoring Program was financially supported by BAF and saw 10 mentors and 10 mentees successfully participate in the introductory day, once again led by Dr. Tamara Boyd and assisted by BAF Alumnus Pauline O'Shannessy-Dowling. This was held at the Golden City Hotel. Yet again, this session revealed the magic of the matches as the potential of the pairings became obvious even in this first session. Watch this space for outcomes!!

And finally, the 2022 Grant Round opened on June 1, with a Grant Round Information night happening on-line on 22nd June.

We are always so thankful and humbled to be able to provide support to the emerging artists of Ballarat and in some way contribute to the understanding of the importance of the Arts in our community through our events program. This is only possible with the support of that community and we thank you all for your contributions and attendance!
